Keynote Speaker - *Sister Nancy Kehoe, RSCJ, MEd, Ph.D.*



As both a licensed psychologist and a nun, keynote speaker Sister Nancy Kehoe, will share her unique perspective on the role of faith and spirituality in treating mental illness. Dr. Kehoe is an Instructor in Psychology in the Department of Psychiatry at the Cambridge Health Alliance, affiliated with Harvard Medical School, and a member of the Religious of the Sacred Heart. Highlights of thirty years of pioneering work incorporating spiritual and religious beliefs with mental health treatment include: developing a model for leading patient discussion groups on spiritual beliefs and values; creating a comprehensive Religious History Assessment tool that enables professionals to explore client's religious and spiritual history; and authoring “Wrestling with Our Inner Angels: Faith, Mental Illness, and the Journey to Wholeness.” Through Expanding Connections, a training and consultation service that works with healthcare agencies, mental health facilities, and other social service providers, Dr. Kehoe trains others to continue the work she has begun.

Special guest speaker Barbara (Bebe) Smith, MSW, LCSW, of UNC-CH's School of Social Work, will talk on “Mental Illness and Being Human.” Smith is project director for Critical Time Intervention, an evidence-based intensive case management model designed to assist persons with mental illness make successful transitions from homelessness to housing or from institution to community. Smith focuses on psychotic disorders with interventions and strategies that are key to social work practice.
